SHE LEADS PROJECT

Funded by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the She Leads Project is a five-year (2021-2025) strategic initiative that aims to increase the sustained influence of girls and young women (GYW) in decision-making processes and the transformation of gender norms in formal and informal institutions.

- One of our GYW (Ms. Janet Adomah Nti) has been appointed as a member of the Development Committee of her community, Akutuase; responsible for leading and overseeing developmental Initiatives in the community.
- We strengthened the leadership capacity of 982 girls and young women in the Asante Akim North Municipal.
- To ensure project sustainability, we introduced the She Leads GYW-friendly mentorship modules in 2 senior high schools in the Asante Akim North Municipal.

EMPOWERING ADOLESCENT GIRLS WITH DISABILITIES FOR IMPROVED SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH SERVICES (EAGDIS) PROJECT

Funded by the AWDF, the EAGDIS Project aimed to empower adolescent girls with disabilities in the Asante Akim Central Municipal on their sexual and reproductive health rights.

- 6 girls- with-disabilities were identified and enrolled on the Asante Akim Central Social Welfare Department's support program for person's living with disabilities.
- 150 adolescent girls-with-disabilities received comprehensive education and support to improve their sexual and reproductive health needs.

PROJECT I MENSTRUATE

Project iMenstruate 2024 aimed at providing in-school girls with comprehensive menstrual hygiene education and access to free and quality sanitary products.

- 500 girls in 5 schools the Asante Akim Central Municipality received comprehensive menstrual health education.
- 1,812 sanitary products were distributed.

GIRLS IDENTITY SUMMIT (GIS)

In collaboration with Girls Identity Summit Inc., GIS 2024 aimed to help girls in Ghana build self-esteem, develop leadership skills, and recognize the value of community service.

- In March, a mentoring curriculum was launched in 10 schools in the Ashanti Region of Ghana.
- During our first monitoring and evaluation visit to the 10 schools in November, a total of 1,031 girls had benefited from the curriculum.

MILESTONES & ACHIEVEMENTS

- Launched the 'I See Me Mentoring Curriculum' in 10 schools in the Ashanti Region of Ghana.
- Provided education and sanitary products to 500 school girls in the Ashanti Region of Ghana to help keep them in school.
- Acquired funding from the African Women's Development Fund (AWDF) to support 150 adolescent girls with disabilities on their sexual and reproductive health needs.
- Represented at the Beijing+30 Africa Regional Consultations in Addis Ababa, where we had the opportunity to add our voices to global conversations on gender equality; amplifying the realities of girls and young women in Ghana.
- Received an award for community impact during the 2024 Asante Akim Central Central August Festival.
- Received a special visitation from Ms. Morgan T. Dixon, Co-founder of GirlTrek USA, where she shared valuable insights with our girls and young women that would shape their visions for the future.
- 2 beneficiaries of the She Leads Project broke barriers in education; - Ms. Monique Kafui Attah emerged as the valedictorian of the 2024 Class of Presbyterian University Ghana, with an FGPA of 3.92 out of 4.0. -Ms. Joycelyn Success Dadzie (a 10-year old girl from Hwidiem M/A Basic School) emerged as the overall winner of the 2024 National Girls in ICT Competition, where she competed with over 1000 girls.

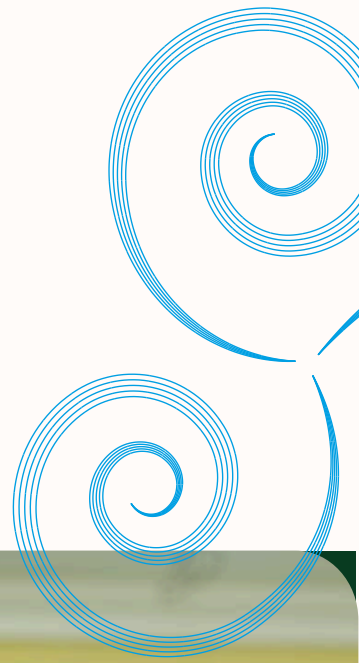
